RULES AND REGULATIONS

ADMISSION

- 1. Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria set by the educational institution as per university admission rules, which typically includes a minimum academic qualification (such a bachelor's degree) from a recognized university or institution.
- 2. Applicants may be required to take an entrance examination to assess their knowledge skills and aptitude for the B.Ed Program. The format and content of the examination will be communicated to applicants in advance.
- 3. Shortlisted candidates may be invited for an interview as part of the admission process.
- 4. The interview may assess the applicant's motivation, communication skills and suitability for the program.
- 5. Admission to the BEd. program is based on a combination of factors, including academic performance, performance in the entrance examination and interview (if applicable) and any other criteria specified by the institution.
- 6. A merit list of selected candidates will be published based on the evaluation of applications, entrance examination results and interview performance (if applicable). Candidates who receive an offer of admission must confirm their acceptance by the specified deadline and pay the required admission fee to secure their place in the program.
- 7. Requests for deferral or withdrawal of admission must be made in writing to the admissions office and will be subject to the institution's policies and procedures.
- **8**. The institution may have a reservation policy for certain categories of applicants as per government regulations or institutional policies.

ACADEMIC

- 9. Regular attendance is mandatory for all classes, seminars, and practicum sessions such as workshops field works, camps and in all other co-curricular activities.
- **10**. Tardiness is not tolerated and may result in penalties.
- 11. Students must adhere to professional standards of behavior at all times, respecting fellow students, faculty and staff.



- **12.** Any form of discrimination, harassment or disruptive behavior is not tolerated.
- 13. Timely submission of assignments, projects and other course requirements is essential.
- **14**. Students participating in practicum or field experience must adhere to the policies and guidelines set by the educational institution.
- **15**. Professionalism, confidentiality, and respect for students, colleagues and supervisors are paramount.

16. STUDY TOUR

Participation in the study tour is mandatory for all students, Failure to attend may lead to reduction in marks or other academic consequences.

17. ETHICS

Timeliness: Students must follow the calendar of working days the time schedule of the College.

Sincerity: Attend every class with attitude and aptitude.

Cleanliness: Cleanliness is next to Godliness. Keep the campus clean. Don't throw any waste in the campus. Use dustbins for the purpose.

Discipline: After the first bell in the morning, every student must be in the classroom. Observe silence during prayer. Keep silence in the library Learn to give respect and take respect.

Modesty: The dress code of the students should be modest, neat and dignified.

18. COLLEGE UNIFORMS

The college uniforms are to be worn on Monday to Friday except on Tuesday and Thursday. Those who appearing at the college without the full and complete uniform attire will have to pay a fine of Rs.100/-

19. USE OF MOBILE PHONE

Use of Mobile phone by the students is strictly prohibited in the class and in the campus. Those found using mobile phones in the campus, will be asked to surrender the same to the principal and may collect it back only on payment of Rs.500/-.



20. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- 1. <u>Attendance will be taken at</u> the beginning of each period.
- 2. If a student is absent for two period, it will be considered absence for half the day and absence for more than two period will be considered absence for the whole day
- 3. No student shall absent himself/herself from the college without proper leave application

21. PUNCHING RULES.

Students must punch in at the designated time (Morning9:15AM to 9:40AM; Evening 3:30 PM to 3:45PM). Late punching will be considered as absent. Ensure that your punch is accurately recorded. Any discrepancies should be reported to the administration immediately.

Grievances if any, shall be brought to the attention of the Students Grievance Redressal Cell in writing. The cell in consultation with the principal shall take necessary steps to resolve such grievances.

22. USE OF COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD

A College Identity Card will be issued to the student at the time of admission. The student should wear this card while in the campus and produce the same on demand for inspection by any staff member. If the card is lost, a duplicate can be obtained on payment of Rs.50/. It may be born in mind that the College identity Card will be required on many occasions such as voting at the College Union Election. Claiming Hall Tickets. Mark lists, Certificates, Scholarships and Stipends etc.

23. SEMESTER FEES REGULATIONS

Semester fees should be paid at the beginning of each semester by the specified deadline to avoid additional changes or penalties. Payments, must be made through approved methods as, and receipts should be retained. Failure to pay may restrict access to academic services. Refunds, if applicable, will adhere to college regulations and as per university order (U.O No. 10499/2024/Admn. dated, Calicut University. P.O, 01/7/2024)

24. Students must use educational resources, facilities and equipment responsibility and in accordance with institutional policies. any misuse or damage to property will result in disciplinary action.

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- 25. Students must regularly check institutional communication channels. (eg. College notice board, Email, website etc.) for updates, announcements and important information.
- 26. Depending on institutional policies, students may be required to adhere to a specific dress code, especially during practicum or field experiences.
- **27.** Plagiarism, cheating or any form of academic dishonesty is strictly prohibited. All assignments, projects ,and examinations must be the student's original work unless properly cited.
- 28. In cases where students are dissatisfied with their internal assessment grades they may request reassessment or review of their work ,following the institution's procedures for such requests.
- 29. Violations of these rules and regulations may result in disciplinary actions, including warming, suspension, or expulsion, depending on the severity of the offense.
- **30**. No student shall leave the classroom during a lecture without the permission of the teacher.
- 31. Students are forbidden from attending or organizing any meeting in the college or to collect money for any purpose without the permission of the principal. They should not circulate among the students any notice or petition or paste it any where in the college premises without a written sanction of the principal. Political activity is strictly banned in the campus. Students resorting to strikes are strictly prohibited from entering the verandha of the building or the classrooms.

32. LIBRARY RULES

- The library will remain open on all working days from 9:00 AM to 4.30PM
- Strict silence shall be observed in the library.
- Usage of Mobile phone is prohibited
- Students must produce their ID to borrow books.
- Without issue or enter in system, books should not allowed to take outside the library
- Books are issued to students for 15 days. Students can renew a book two times.
- If issued books are returned after the due date, a fine of Rs.2/-will be collected per day.

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- Books must not be changed, written on torn or tampered in case of any changes will lead to pay the full cost price of the same book.
- Magazines and journals are meant for study only in the library.
- No personal possessions should be carried inside the library.
- Once the books are issued, it is requested to be kept outside the library.
- Books placed in the reference section will not be issued.
- In case if the book is lost, it should be brought to the notice of the librarian and same book should be replaced immediately.
- Any one who losses book must pay the double of the cost price of the book or replace it with same new book.

COURSE REGULATIONS

Duration of the Programme

The B.Ed. Programme is of four semesters spread over two years duration. However, the students shall be permitted to complete the programme requirements within a maximum of four years from the date of admission to the programme. Classes of First semester shall be started latest by July in all affiliated colleges of University of Calicut. The minimum number of working days in each semester shall be 100 and in each year shall be 200 excluding days of admission and examinations.

Eligibility for Admission

Candidates seeking admission to the B.Ed. programme shall be required to have (i) at least 50% marks or an equivalent grade either in the Bachelor 's degree and/or in the Master 's Degree in Science/ Social



Science/Humanity. (ii) at least 55% marks or an equivalent grade in the Bachelor's degree in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics (In case of B.Tech / B.E degree aggregate marks/grade in Science and Mathematics papers alone will be considered) (iii) Any other qualification equivalent thereto OR the eligibility requirements, rules and regulations for B.Ed. admissions fixed by the University of Calicut from time to time Relaxation in the marks will be allowed in the case of Candidates belonging to scheduled castes / Scheduled tribes/ socially and Educationally Backward classes/PWD and other applicable categories as per the rules of state government.

Medium of Instruction

The medium of instruction shall be English for all courses. However, in case of languages, instruction may be given partly in the language concerned. Medium of examination shall be English/Malayalam. The Language Optional papers shall be written in the language specified in the Question paper.

Attendance For Appearing University Examinations

A student shall be considered to have satisfactory attendance to appear the examination if he/she attends not less than 80% for all theory classes and course work and practicum and 90% for internship. Condonation of shortage of attendance shall be as per existing University rules. Candidates with shortage of attendance beyond condonable limit will not be eligible to register for the end semester University examination. In such cases the candidate has to repeat the course by taking readmission from the University.

Registration for each Semester

All the courses carrying score should be compulsorily attended by all the candidates for the successful completion of the course. Only such candidates are permitted to register for the End Semester University examination. Every candidate should register for all subjects of the end semester examinations of 1st, 2nd and 4th semester before its closure. But for the 3rd semester (Since having no End Semester Theory Examinations), registration is to be done after the closure of the semester. A candidate who does not register will not be permitted to attend the end-semester examinations; he/she shall not be permitted to attend the next semester. A candidate shall be eligible to register for any higher



semester, if he/she has satisfactorily completed the course of study and registered for the examination of the immediate previous semester. He/she should register for the semester before the stipulated date. University will notify the date of registration and the starting and closing dates for each semester.

Re admission rules

Those candidates who discontinue the course can be given the provision of readmission if otherwise eligible as long as the same scheme exists. There shall be provision for readmission in the same institution in the second, third and fourth semesters within a period of three years for those who have satisfactorily completed first, second and third semesters respectively and also registered for the previous semester University Examination, provided there is vacancy in the institution and the syllabus being the same. Re admission shall be permitted during the first week of 2nd, 3rd and 4th semester.

Additional Optional

In the fourth semester, students shall choose one additional optional course from the subjects prescribed in the syllabus and offered by the institution.

Seminar

Seminars are an important part of professional life. B.Ed. students are expected to present one seminar paper on an educationally relevant theme during the 4th semester. 50 hours is set apart for the seminar. The whole batch of students should be assigned seminar presentation.(Refer annexure-II)

Scheme of instruction

There shall be 100 contact hours for the instruction of each theory course with *full weightage* (100 marks Course) Fifteen hours is also assigned for tasks and assignments, college based practicals/tests of each full weightage theory course. 50 contact hours is allotted for the instruction of each theory course with *half weightage* (50 marks Course) and eight hours is also assigned for tasks and assignments/ college based practicals/tests of each half weightage theory course. There shall be basic unit of 50 students each for Core Papers and not more than 25 students per teacher educator for Optional papers and other Practical courses of the programme to facilitate participatory teaching and learning.



For instructional purpose all courses under Perspectives in Education viz. EDU 01, EDU 02, EDU 06, EDU 07, EDU 10, EDU 11, EDU 12 and courses under Curriculum and Pedagogic Studies viz. EDU 03, EDU 04, EDU 08 are considered as CORE COURSES. However the specific area/ content in EDU 04 could be dealt with by concerned optional teachers. Courses EDU 05.1-13, EDU 09.1-13 and EDU 13.1-13 are optional courses Courses EDU 14.1-7 are Additional Optional courses. Institutions with 50 annual intakes should offer a minimum of two courses from this; institutions with 100 annual intakes should offer at least three courses from this category. Faculty can cater to both Perspective and Pedagogy courses and also courses on EPC and be utilized for teaching in flexible manner so as to optimize expertise available.

Procedure for completing the course

A candidate shall be required to complete the B.Ed. programme after undergoing the prescribed courses of study in a college affiliated to the university for four semesters within a period of not less than two years; clear all the examinations prescribed and fulfill all such conditions as prescribed by the University from time to time. However the maximum duration permissible for taking the B.Ed. programme is fixed as 3 years after joining the course.

Eligibility for the Degree

No candidate shall be eligible for the B.Ed. degree unless he/she has undergone the prescribed course of study for a period of not less than two academic years in an institution affiliated to the University of Calicut and has passed all subjects as per the prescribed syllabus.

Revision of Regulation:

Notwithstanding all that has been stated above, the university has the right to modify any of the regulations, scheme and syllabus of the programme from time to time as per university rules.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION &INTERNAL ASSESSMENT.

Assessment of Students

Assessment of students for each subject will be done by internal continuous assessment and end semester examinations. Internal assessment shall be conducted throughout the semester. It shall be based on internal examinations, assignments (such as Tasks and assignments



that run through all courses.) as specified in the syllabus. End-semester examinations of theory subjects will be conducted by the University and those of all practical subjects will be conducted at institutional level. There shall be End Semester University Examinations in 1st, 2nd and 4th semesters. 3rd semester is an exclusive Practical semester and hence there will be no End Semester University Examinations for theory in the 3rd semester. However, results of the Practical courses internally evaluated will be published by the university. End-semester examinations will be conducted only once in a year; failed candidates will have to appear for the end-semester examinations along with regular students of the next batch. To ensure transparency of the evaluation process, the student should be made aware of the criteria / indicators of assessment well in advance and the internal assessment marks awarded to the students in each course (theory and practical) shall be published on the notice board at least one week before the commencement of external examination so as to enable the students to report any corrections. There shall not be any chance for improvement for internal marks. There shall be no separate minimum for internal assessment of theory courses. Students may seek redress of grievances of internal evaluation at the teacher educator level or at the college evaluation committee level. The consolidated mark lists of all courses of a semester shall be submitted to the University immediately after the closure of each semester.

Assessment in theory subjects

The ratio of internal to external examination for theory courses is 20:80. The marks allotted for internal continuous assessment and end semester university examinations shall be 20 marks 80 marks respectively with a maximum of hundred marks for each theory subject with full weightage and shall be 10 marks and 40 marks respectively with a maximum of 50 marks for each theory subject with half weightage.

Internal evaluation: the internal evaluation of theory courses shall be based on predetermined transparent system involving periodic written tests, Practicum\tasks and assignments. The weightage to award internal continuous assessment marks should be as follows:

Test papers (minimum two for 100 marks courses and one for 50 courses) -50%

Task and assignments (minimum two for 100 marks courses and one for 50 courses) – 50%

FIELD TRIPS/STUDY TOUR (30 Hours- 20 Marks)

Educational Tour is aimed to provide an exposure to students to study and appreciate. It is an exposure trip to a place of educational or historical importance. The expected outcome includes providing situations for the student-teachers to learn and get acquainted with the process of organizing /conducting a study tour/field trip and understanding the environment around. A Study Tour/ 2 Field trips shall be mandatory for all students. Those students who fail to attend the Study/Tour Field trips shall forfeit the marks (20 marks) allotted for thus activity. No other activity could be assigned to the absentee student in lieu of the Study Tour/ Field trips.

The study tour can be organized by the institution at their convenience as a general programme/Optional requirement. The students may undertake one study tour preferably during the holidays taking not exceeding 3 working days, combined with the holidays if required. Total number of Tour days shall not exceed 6 days. The tour period shall be considered as part of the working periods of a semester

A feedback session, within a fortnight of returning from the tour shall be mandatory. The faculty should encourage the students to reflect on the experiences based on their observations. The students shall be required to prepare individual reports of the visits. The report should highlight the objectives of the tour, identification of the spot, detailed plan, execution of the plan, benefits derived from the tour, problems faced and suggestions. The reports should also contain an evaluation of their own inputs for planning and implementing the tour.

RulesRelating to the Grantof Condonation of Shortage of Attendance

- Condonation is not granted as a matter of course; it will be granted only incases where the students could not attain 75/ 80 per cent of the attendance for reasons beyond their control, provided the shortage of attendance is with in the condonable limit
- Purpose of remittance should be clearly stated as "Fee for Condonation of Shortage of Attendance" and "Late fee for condonation", if late fee is required. Fee and Late fee can be remitted in the same chalan.
- Applications for condonation should be accompanied by detailed statements in the formgiven below showing the days of absence during the academic year with reasons for eachdays absence.
- 4. In the case of illness such applications should be supported by proper medical Certificate, if the absence is for 5 or more days consecutively.
- Each application should be accompanied by a Treasury Chalan receipt towards the fee remitted to the Calicut University Fund under the specific head of account of the University. Condonation fee for Semester Course is Rs.350/-(for shortage upto 10%) Rs.400 (for shortage above 10%)

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- 6. Applications which are not specifically recommended by the Principal will not be entertained.
- Applications not conforming to the above rules will not be considered.
- 8. The total number of working days in a semester should not be less than 90 days and foryearlycourseitshouldbebetween 180-190 days in a semester should not be less than 90 days and foryearlycourseitshouldbebetween 180-
- 9. In case the shortage of attendance is beyond condonable limit such students must repeat the course for making up the shortage of attendance to become eligible for APC and then register for the examination along with their junior batch.
- 10. The Principal should not forward the applications for condonation of those students who have shortage of attendance beyond condonable limit.
- 11. Application for condonation along with a covering letter showing all details should befor warded to The Registrar, University of Calicut, Calicut University P.O., Pin-673635 bypost, two weeks before the commencement of the University Exam. Alate fee Rs.1000/- should be remitted for applications received after the academic yearconcerned.
