



Book Review: Half girl friend by Chetan Bhagat.

Half Girlfriend is a Contemporary Romance novel by Indian author Chetan Bhagat. The story follows Madhav Jha, a simple, small-town boy from Bihar and Riya Soman, a rich and sophisticated girl from Delhi, as they navigate their complicated relationship.

Madhav and Riya meet at St. Stephen's College in Delhi. Despite their contrasting backgrounds and lifestyles, they bond over a mutual interest in basketball. - c) Language Barrier : Madhav's struggle with English is symbolic of his feelings of inadequacy in an elite environment, a reflection on societal pressures in India.
- d) Self-Discovery : Both Madhav and Riya go through a journey of self-realization as they navigate their feelings and circumstances.

Writing Style

Bhagat's writing is simple and accessible, often blending humor and emotion in a way that resonates with young readers. The book's straightforward language and relatable characters make it an easy read, though it has been criticized for being formulaic and predictable.

Critique :


