Science lab setting and arrangement

In the newly constructed science laboratory at GHS Leulam, meticulous planning and organization have been employed to ensure efficiency, safety and ease of access for both students and instructors. The lab setting is divided into 3 distinct sections, each dedicated to a specific scientific discipline; physics, chemistry and biology. This spatial division optimizes the utilization of resources and enhances the overall learning experiences.

Physics Section

In physics section of the lab is well organized with various apparatus and equipment, such as pendulums, optic tools and electronic devices, have been thoroughly arranged. The arrangement prioritizes ease of access and convenience during experiments. Key elements, like the optical bench, are placed near the windows to benefit from the natural light. The section's organization reflects a logical sequence of topics covered in the physics curriculum, making it easier for both students and teachers to locate the necessary materials.

chemistry Sections

The chemistry section of the lab is well organized with chemicals arranged methodically. To enhance safety and efficiency, chemicals are located and labelled and stored

in alphabetical order. This arrangement makes it straightforward for students to locate specific chemicals, reducing the chances of confusion or accidents during experiments. All containers are properly sealed and marked with their chemical names, molecular formulas and hazard symbols in accordance with safety regulations.

Biology Sections

The biology section is designed to cater to the specific needs of biology experiments and discussions. Microscopes, slides and specimens are neatly arranged on dedicated shelves. Larger equipment, such as microscopes and incubators, are strategically placed for ease of access without obstructing the working space. In this section, microscopes are aligned with ample counter space, ensuring students have an adequate work area for their practical work.

Overall, the newly constructed science laboratory at GHS Ileolum is a model of efficient organisation and safety.
